THE YOUNG musicians will get together Friday to begin intensive rehearsals, their first group rehearsals since a workshop at Green Lake last summer. The rehearsals will continue through Saturday, and they will go

The honors concert will be one of three evening programs open to the public, and the only one with admission charge.

Two University ensembles will get together for Friday's program at 8 p.m. in Mills Concert Hall of the Humanities Building. The UW-River Falls Concert Choir, directed by Eliot R. Wold, will sing of music of Heinrich Schutz, Hugh Distler, Ralph Vaughan Williams, Neil Saunders, Earl George, Aaron Copland, as well as a piece by Wold. The UW-Eau Claire Symphony Band, directed by Donald S. George, will include a Sousa march and music by Arthur Sullivan-Charles Mackerras; Norman Dello Joio, and Andreas Makris in its section of the program.

THE UNIVERSITY of Wisconsin's Pro Arte String Quartet will be joined by Armand Basile, UW-M faculty pianist, Sunday at 8 p.m. in Mills Hall for a concert including Ravel's "Trio in A Minor" for violin, piano, and cello; Webern's "Quartet," Op. 28; and Brahms' "Quintet in F Minor," Op. 34 for piano and strings.

Contrary to a published announcement, the lecture demonstrations Sunday morning and afternoon by pianist Ruth Slenczynska, artist in residence at Southern Illinois University, is open only to those registered for the convention.
